Principal's report

I've included our current enrollment numbers below. As of count day, our total enrollment is nearly the same as last year. The smallest class this year is seniors. While it is normal for the number of students in a class to decline after each year of high school, the class of 2022 was lower than usual since their freshman year. New student enrollments tend to slow down as the school year progresses. We enrolled one new student on 10/5.

We were thrilled with the turnout for our homecoming events this year. There were an estimated 750 to 1,000 people that attended the extravaganza Wednesday night. We also held our first pep rally since the pandemic, and around two thousand people attended the football game Friday night vs. Leavenworth. The homecoming dance was a rousing success on Saturday night, hosting 525 student attendees.

We continue to look for ways to resume normal activities for students while keeping a watchful eye on our COVID positive numbers. We feel these events are critical to maintaining our sense of pride, spirit, and community.
