Welcome to the 2022-2023 school year! We are thrilled to welcome our returning Lansing USD 469 families and those new to our district. It has been an honor and pleasure to have been a part of the Lansing School District over the past 26 years, having served as a teacher, building administrator, district administrator, and now starting my third year as Superintendent.

Last year was a successful year in USD469. The addition of Miles Azzeh as our Director of Teaching and Learning was a highlight at the district level. His passion for reading at all grade levels will help prepare our students for their futures. His leadership in updating the Guaranteed and Viable Curriculum will help align our classrooms for a consistent, high-level experience for ALL of our students. USD469 also increased our communication efforts with monthly informative videos from the district and high school levels. Highlighting information for our community and parents helps to strengthen the partnerships between our schools and the neighbors we serve.

This new school year offers some new opportunities for input into our school system. The USD469 Board of Education voted to go through a formal strategic planning process beginning in September. Please consider adding your input to the process by serving on the committee. This will help set the district's direction over the next five years and make our district more aligned with our community's needs and wants.

Two other major changes coming this way will impact our families differently. Last year, our district piloted an activity bus for students that needed a ride after practices and tutoring at the secondary level. We will continue this program through the next school year. This increased access is incredibly important for students to be actively engaged in school. Another change from the last two school years is that lunches will no longer be free for all students. The rules will revert back to an application process to be eligible for free/reduced meals. Hungry students make it difficult to learn. Please reach out with any questions to the district office.

REGISTRATION

RETURNING STUDENTS

Please call the schools for access if you do not have your parent/guardian login and password. You will NOT be able to register with your student's Skyward login and password. Registration for returning students is now open.

NEW STUDENTS / KINDERGARTEN ENROLLMENT

For **NEW** and **KINDERGARTEN** students, click **REGISTER** on the district website to acquire an ID and password to start the enrollment process. If you already have an ID and password for Skyward Family Access, you can access the new student online registration by using the same account information. It will be the top tab on the left.

Once you login and fill out the required information for each enrolling student, the application will be sent to the registrar of the attending school for approval and an email confirmation will be sent.

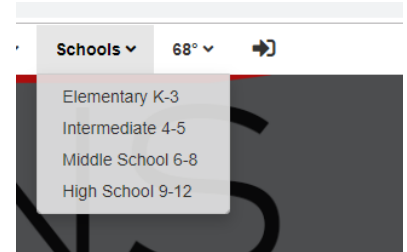

Be sure your device is set to receive Notifications from the Lansing USD 469 app as well. If your notifications are turned off, you will not be alerted of important information sent from the district.

TECHNOLOGY

Our district mobile device management program, Mosyle, allows parents to set restrictions on student(s) iPad outside of school hours (7:30 am - 4:30 pm) to meet usage expectations at home.

The parent can do things like:

- Set Screen Time allowances
- Remotely Lock The Student's iPad
- Lock the student's iPad into an App
- Hide Apps from the student's iPad

MOSYLE manager & ScreenGuide

ScreenGuide Parental Control app allows you to set parental controls and configure rules for the safe, fun, and educational use of tablets and smartphones - while minimizing potential risks such as cyberbullying, inappropriate content consumption, and overexposure to screens. To set up and start managing your child's school device, just follow the steps below:

- 1 Start by downloading the ScreenGuide app on your personal device - you can look for the app on the App Store (for iOS devices) or Play Store (for Android devices), or by visiting <http://screen.guide/download>.
- 2 Enter your email to create your account.
- 3 Fill out your account info and click "SIGN UP".
- 4 Click "CREATE A FAMILY" to continue.
- 5 Type your family name and click "CREATE".
- 6 Next, add your child to your account.
- 7 Select "I'm adding a school managed device".
- 8 Using the browser on your child's device, access the highlighted blue link.
- 9 You will be redirected to the Mosyle Manager app - enter your ScreenGuide login credentials:

Once you login with your ScreenGuide account info, within the Mosyle Manager app, you'll be prompted to enter a passcode in order to connect your child's school-managed device to your ScreenGuide account. Enter the passcode shown here:

For those families who will have bus riders during the 2022-2023 school year, registration for bussing began on Wednesday, July 6. Students must live in the district and not in a Walk Zone to be eligible to ride.

REMINDER: BUS REGISTRATION WILL TAKE PLACE FROM JULY 6 - AUGUST 4, 2022.

- The registration fee is \$25.00 per household.
- Students must register by August 4 to ride on the first day of school. Our transportation needs the time to plan bus routes and ensure the first day of school runs smoothly.
- The fee will increase to \$35.00 for families that sign up after the seven-day window.
- Free and reduced students who are eligible for transportation will ride free but still need to meet the registration deadline.

Late Registrations will be \$35.00 per household, and students' first eligible day to ride the bus will be August 29.

PLEASE NOTE: You will pay the bus fee through Skyward's Fee Management system, but it will not immediately appear in your account.

Parents can see their child's bus number and pick-up/drop-off times in Skyward after August 10. Check the bussing tab on your Skyward Family Access page to access that information. If you have questions, contact Janine Shields at 913-250-0749.

Immunization Requirements for the 2022 - 2023 School Year

K.A.R. 28-1-20 defines immunizations required for any individual who attends school or a childcare program operated by a school. Below are the requirements for the indicated school year. Please carefully review the requirements. The usual number of doses required are listed; however there are exceptional circumstances that could alter the number of doses a child needs. If you have questions about your child's immunization status, contact your child's primary care provider or local health department.

Proof of receiving the required immunizations must be provided to the school prior to the student attending the first day of school.

*Students entering 11th and 12th grade having received no previous dose of MenACWY: **One dose is required for school entry and this completes the series.***

*Students entering 11th and 12th grade having received one previous dose of MenACWY, **and it has been at least 8 weeks since the first dose: A second dose is required for school entry and this completes the series.***

Notes

* Varicella (chickenpox) vaccine is not required if child has had chickenpox disease **and** disease is documented by a physician signature. Without a physician signature, vaccine is still required even if you believe your child has had chickenpox disease.

**Total doses needed are dependent on vaccine type and child's age when the doses were administered.

***Three doses are acceptable if the 3rd dose was given after 4 years of age and there are at least 6 months between the second and third doses.

~ All students in grades 7-12 must have one dose of Tdap regardless of the interval since the last dose of DTaP or Td.

Additional ACIP RECOMMENDED Vaccines Not Required for School Entry

- **Influenza (Flu): Annual vaccine recommended for everyone 6 months of age and older.**
- **HPV (Human Papillomavirus) Vaccine:**
2 doses recommended at age 11 years
2 doses needed if started at 11-14 years
3 doses needed if started at 15 years or older
